DID YOU KNOW?

- Commercial & Residential Contractors
 Contractors, owners, and possibly local governing bodies can be assessed fines and penalties for failing to meet asbestos regulatory requirements for remodeling or demolition of property.
 - A licensed professional must perform lead, radon and asbestos abatement.
 - Contractors must meet federal lead requirements when remodeling residential property built before 1978.
 - Construction and demolition debris must be transported and disposed of according to Illinois EPA Regulations.
 - Lead and asbestos regulations vary depending on previous property use, as well as, future property use after the remodeling/demolition.
 - A mold problem is a moisture problem and all types of mold should be treated with respect.
 - Virtually every building permit and real estate transaction in Illinois requires a floodplain determination.

Lead Hazards

Learn how to address lead-based paint issues when working in residential dwellings and child-care facilities, as well as disclosure requirements for renovators and remodelers working in older homes. Training and licensure requirements for persons that disturb lead-based paint will be discussed.

Radon

When radon resistant is completed correctly, it can result in a health benefit and save consumers time and money. Floodplain 101

Over 15% of Illinois is mapped as "floodplain" and floods are the state's most costly natural hazard. Virtually every building permit and real estate transaction in Illinois requires a floodplain determination. This introductory session is designed for both the construction industry and the lender/realtor sector. Attendees will learn how to identify a floodplain and how federal, state, and local floodplain regulations impact development. The session will cover floodplain management concepts and definitions, floodplain mapping, basic state and local permit requirements, and flood insurance.
